- 1) The Group Co-Coordinator, Mr. Gabriel Fernández del Pino Búrdalo, after a round of introduction welcomed all members in attendance to the meeting and expressed regret that some members were not able to attend the meeting. No Government representative was present. The Co-coordinator informed he is trying that his Government counterpart will attend these meetings and, more important, to work closer with her in the whole coordination of the ESF 6, specifically in the Shelter Sector.
- 2) We skipped this point as there is no previous minutes of the ESF 6 CCCM + Shelter last meeting.
- 3) Updates:
 - 3.1 on the two hubs coordination: there are ESF 6 Shelter Co-coordinator working closely with the EOC Representative and OCHA. Partners are happy with the actual Ws system, but some of us seriously question whether NEMA is really going to take over from OCHA. Therefore, we will be monitoring and we may be prepared to set up a plan B for ceasing production.
 - 3.2 Interesting long conversation around these locations / the Haitians issue. Land tenure and Protection issues could arise, so we need to be alert. The main conclusion is that this statement does not prevent the delivery of any immediate humanitarian shelter, but as the order is valid for six months and may be extended for periods of six months, we need to look at how to support the affected persons their transition from emergency shelter to a more permanent shelter. Some agencies stand back their delivery, some came back to deliver, others are monitoring.
 - 3.3 Potential plans of some agencies such as IOM, Samaritan Purse, or Chrysalis have similar plans of shelter recovery. The Co-coordinator proposed a Technical Working Group on T-

shelter with the objective of producing a simple 1 page concept note with T-shelter possible modalities to be presented to the Government. These mentioned agencies and the private sector agreed on meeting and develop this product with the support of the Co-coordinator for the ESF 6 Shelter Sector group.
