
Cyclone Remal Situation Update 28 May 2024



Situation overview:

Cyclone Remal made landfall near the Bangladesh-India border, at the western part of Sundarbans in Shatkhira district. The highest recorded wind speed was 111 km/h at 1:30 am on May 27th, according to BMD in Khepupara of Patuakhali coastal district.

The storm surge, accompanied by extremely heavy rainfall, caused flooding of 5-8 feet in the coastal districts. Remal weakened into a Cyclonic Storm and then to a Land Deep Depression over Jashore and adjoining areas, continuing its path over Bangladesh.





Key Impacts (As of 28 May 2024):



19 District affected



Khulna, Bagerhat, Satkhira, Patuakhali and Barguna are the most affected districts



3.7 M people affected in 19 Districts.



10 death confirmed



Over 807,023 people have been evacuated to 9,424 evacuation shelters across

Women, Children, the elderly and Persons with Disability are found to be the most affected



150,475 houses damaged fully or partially whereas 35,483 are fully and 114,992 are partially

Shelter Cluster Proposed Response Activities:

Emergency Shelter Support: Provide tarpaulins, toolkits, and fixing materials along with technical guidance to shield displaced individuals from severe weather conditions.

Essential Household Supplies: Provide vital items such as clothing, mosquito nets, cooking utensils, candles, fireboxes etc., supplemented with necessary guidance to ensure their effective use.

Housing Repair Assistance: Extend support and technical expertise to households needing to repair their damaged homes, ensuring a swift return to safety and normalcy.

Transitional Shelter Support: Deliver solutions for long-term shelter needs, ensuring a secure, healthful, and private living environment that upholds the dignity of its residents.

Host Family Assistance: Offer support to both families hosting and being hosted by friends, relatives, or neighbours. This support encompasses the provision of essential household item kits, cooking equipment, relocation aid, cash support programs, and assistance in expanding living spaces.

Rental Assistance: When relevant, subsidize full or partial rental costs to guarantee individuals and families a safe and dignified temporary residence.



Shelter Cluster Proposed Response package:

- ☐ Emergency shelter support US\$ 50 80/HH
- ☐ Essential Households items US\$ 50 80/HH
- ☐ Housing Repair support US\$ 150 200/HH
- ☐ Transitional Shelter support US\$ 1000 1300/HH
- □ Rental assistance US\$ 50 60/HH aligned with multipurpose cash



Proposed Target Criteria by the Shelter Cluster

- ☐ House damaged fully or partially, loss of essential household items.
- ☐ Still not reconstructed the damaged houses and needs others' assistance and/or less capacity to reconstruct without external assistance.
- □ Displaced and living in collective centres or relatives' houses or others' houses.
- ☐ Households with vulnerable groups (persons with disabilities, womenheaded households, pregnant women, elderly people, widow, hijra etc.) will be given priority.



Response (As of 27 May 2024):

□BDRCS has allocated 9,700 tarpaulins and 1,900 sleeping mats for Patuakhali, Pirojpur, Barguna, Satkhira and Bagerhat districts

□ Islamic Relief has allocated GBP 100,000 for Cyclone Remal response efforts in Barguna district.
