Overview

In May 2025, the Ethiopia ES/NFI Cluster launched its digital Common Pipeline Request Tracking System, known as the Cluster Pipeline, using IOM's technical infrastructure. This Cluster-led, partner-oriented platform enables the fast-tracked and transparent request, review, and approval of available shelter and NFI resources, improving coordination between cluster leadership and implementing partners for a stronger humanitarian response.

Objective

The Common Pipeline's primary objective is to ensure the timely, cost-effective, and quality delivery of essential emergency shelter items. By utilizing IOM's established procurement systems, global supply agreements, and logistical capacity, the pipeline provides durable materials that meet humanitarian standards and reach affected populations without unnecessary delays.

Support to Partners

The system helps partners overcome common challenges such as inflated local market prices, substandard materials, and prolonged procurement processes. Through real-time capacity updates and a centralized approval process, partners gain reliable access to pre-positioned stock, enabling them to plan and respond more effectively in emergency situations.

Progress

Since its launch, the Common Pipeline has facilitated coordinated distributions to affected populations in multiple regions. In South Wello (Amhara), Central Zone (Tigray), and East Borena (Oromia), displaced households received vital shelter support just ahead of the rainy season. Additional responses are underway in North Wello, demonstrating the system's value in ensuring rapid, well-coordinated humanitarian action, reaching a total of 24,310 displacement-affected people.


