

Syria Shelter & NFI Response June Overview

Monthly Achievements

In June 2025, partners provided NFI assistance to over 26,843 individuals with core and winter NFI kits, including cash assistance.

Cluster partners also met the shelter needs of over 22,821 individuals in June through IDP site infrastructure improvements, dignified shelter construction. emergency shelter provision, and rehabilitation of damaged or unfinished shelters.

As-Sweida Emergency Response

Needs


- As of 24 July 2025, at least 176,000 people have been displaced within As-Sweida and to neighboring governorates, including Dar'a and Rural Damascus. The majority of the displaced remain within As-Sweida Governorate.
- There is a critical need for core non-food items (NFIs), particularly blankets, mattresses, plastic sheets, solar lamps, jerry cans, and kitchen sets. These items are essential for internally displaced persons (IDPs) currently residing in overcrowded public buildings, such as schools and religious structures, which often lack adequate water, sanitation, and electricity.
- Should the displacement become prolonged, shelter support may be required. This includes upgrading collective shelters and conducting minor repairs to conflict-affected houses to facilitate safe, dignified, and voluntary returns.

Response

- As of 26 July 2025, Shelter and NFI Sector partners—including UNHCR, SARC, GOPA, IRS, Takaful Al Sham, SKT, Violet, ONSUR, EPDC, AFH, NRC and others—have delivered a total of: 3,566 Core NFI Kits, Reaching approximately 18.303 individuals across Dar'a and Rural Damascus governorates.
- This includes a mix of complete kits—containing blankets, mattresses, plastic sheets, kitchen sets, solar lamps, and other core items—as well as partial kits, distributed based on stock availability and localized needs.
- Additional interventions have included: Provision of solar energy systems (solar panels, LED lights, batteries, and control panels) in schools used as collective shelters in Eastern Maliha. Cash assistance for NFIs by NRC in select shelters in Izra' District and Upgrades and light improvements to collective shelters to enhance safety and living conditions.
- The response has covered a broad range of displacement-affected locations, including but not limited to: Busra Esh-Sham, Moraba, Hrak, Izra', Mseifra, Sayda, Sahwa, Smad, Simej, Ghasm, Karak, Khrbet Ghazaleh, Kherbet Elsheyab, Neimeh, Da'el, Khebab, Jbab, Nashabiyeh, Sayyeda Zeinab, and surrounding rural areas.
- The sector continues to coordinate closely with partners and local authorities to monitor needs, mobilize available stocks, and plan for potential shelter support as the situation evolves.
