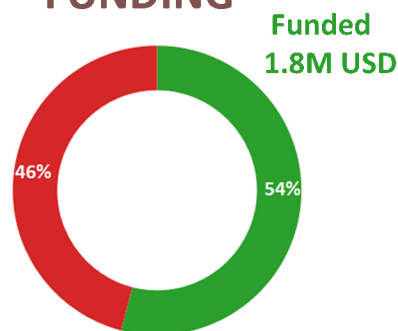


## COVID-19 Response Plan

This Dashboard presents some information on the shelter activities related to COVID19 pandemic, and responses provided by Shelter Cluster members in the West Bank (Area C, East Jerusalem) and Gaza .The responses focus on several aspects including, but not limited to, the activities presented in this report. Since March until June 2020 more than 31,000 individuals have been reached with adequate shelter support in both WB and Gaza.

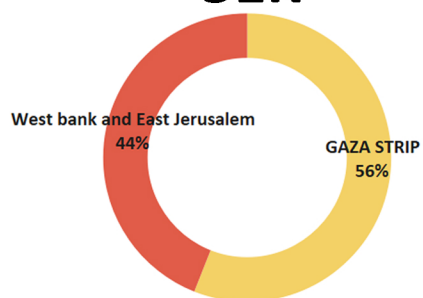

### Gaza Strip

Shelter Cluster partners have continued to support vulnerable people in quarantine facilities and inadequate shelters in the Gaza Strip by provision of non-food items (NFIs) to all active quarantine facilities including bedding sets individual hygiene kits and dignity kits as disaggregated in the table below:

Shelter cluster partners anticipate that additional resources are required to be able to respond to the needs at quarantine facilities and vulnerable households until the end of the year by further prepositioning of NFIs .

### Jerusalem and WB

The cluster partners targeted families in 61 herding and marginalized communities in area C, providing essential hygiene and disinfectant items, and COVID related awareness materials to people at higher risk of being affected by the pandemic.

### Gaps, challenges and constraints

A main constraint is the lack of quality household disaggregated information on needs to accurately target interventions compounded by the movement restrictions that impede access to the most vulnerable households and communities.

The lack of accurate information about the quarantine facilities needs in WB, and the prioritized poor families at home quarantine impede the cluster ability to mobilize required NFI materials' support.
