- Abigail Barlow & Emily Bear — young, Grammy-winning composers mentored by Miranda.
- Opetia Foa'i — returns to incorporate traditional Polynesian sounds.
- Mark Mancina — provides orchestral depth, blending Western and island traditions.

Key Notes:

- The soundtrack mixes English lyrics with Polynesian languages for authenticity.
- Released November 22, 2024, just before the film's premiere.
- Deluxe edition includes instrumentals and extended orchestral pieces.

While fans praised the musical variety, some noted the songs lacked the "instant classic" feel of "How Far I'll Go." Still, the music has been celebrated for its authenticity and emotional resonance.
